THE NORTHEAST FRIESIAN HORSE Club (NEFHC) hosted the New England Keuring, held at Cheshire Fair Grounds in Swanzy, NH, on September 30. The day started with three horses riding the IBOP. Arjen v.d. Ulesprong, a seven-year-old gelding owned by Eugene Sweeney of Runnymede Farm in Hampton, NH, was the IBOP Champion with a score of 77. Ridden by Maciel Dum, "Arjen" showed his strong trot, suppleness, and power from behind. Later, he became ster and champion of the geldings. Take note of this amazing gelding, as his future is bright in the dressage arena!

After the IBOPs, we had the pleasure of viewing three amazing Friesian stallions. First up was Hamlet L.S.F., a five-year-old owned by Lynn B. Wellenstein of Ladyslipper Farm in Candor, NY. Trained by Rebecca Eccard of Elite Equine Enterprises, "Hamlet" didn't take long to impress the judges with his powerful trot and floaty movement. It took only minutes for him to be pronounced ster stallion.

Next was Lauw fan 'e Goengamieden,

owned by Annika Bruggeworth of Friesian Season LLC in Mays Landing, NJ. Already a ster stallion, we watched this four-year- old's presentation with jaw dropping amazement. He moved strongly, with a huge trot and a graceful yet commanding presence. The judges took videos at liberty of "Lauw" to bring back to the KFPS for consideration into the stallion approval process.

Lastly, four-year-old Jasper L.S.F., owned by Bill Piazza of Lazy Stallion Farm of West Bridgewater, MA, was presented. The well-built stallion had an impressive statue, earning third preemie.

Our Colt Champion was Zephyr of Runnymede, a tall, flashy mover earning a second preemie. The Filly Champion and third overall Champion of the Day was Yardley SHF owned and bred by Meghan Hamilton of Sleepy Hollow Farms in Dartmouth, MA. Meghan has high hopes for this filly in the dressage arena.
